### **School Grounds**



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## Notice of Election and Call for Nominations for Kalinda Primary School Council in 2019

An election is to be conducted for members of the School Council of Kalinda Primary School.

Nomination forms may be obtained from the school from 4:00pm this afternoon, Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> February 2019, and must be lodged by 4.00pm on Thursday, 21<sup>st</sup> February 2019.

The ballot will close at 4.00pm on Friday, 1<sup>st</sup> March 2019 at 4:00pm.

School Council Nomination forms may be for a Self-Nomination form for Parent Member category or a Nomination form for Parent Member category.

Following the closing of nominations a list of the nominations received will be posted at the school. The terms of office, membership categories and number of positions in each membership category open for election are as follows:

Kalinda Primary School also has **2** Community positions available which will be voted on by the new School Council.

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## School Council Elections 2019 Information for Parents

### ***What is a school council and what does it do?***

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within centrally provided guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

### ***Who is on the school council?***

For most school councils, there are three possible categories of membership:

**A mandated elected Parent category** – more than one third of the total members must be from this category. Department of Education and Training (DET) employees can be Parent members at their child's school as long as they are not employed at the school.

**A mandated elected DET employee category** – members of this category may make up no more than one-third of the total membership of school council. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.

**An optional Community member category** – members are co-opted by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experiences. DET employees are not eligible to be Community members.

Generally, the term of office for all members is about two years. The term of office of half the members expires each year, creating vacancies for the annual school council elections.

### ***Why is Parent membership so important?***

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of the school.

Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying in itself and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

### ***How can you become involved?***

The most obvious way is to vote in the elections, which are held in Term 1 each year. However, ballots are only held if more people nominate as candidates than there are positions vacant. In view of this, you might seriously consider standing for election as a member of the school council encouraging another person to stand for election.

### ***Do I need special experience to be on school council?***

No. What you do need is an interest in your child's school and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future.

### ***What do you need to do to stand for election?***


The principal will issue a notice of election and call for nominations following the commencement of Term 1 each year. All school council elections must be completed by the end of March. If you decide to stand for election, you can arrange for someone to nominate you as a candidate or you can nominate yourself in the Parent category. DET employees whose child is enrolled in a school in which they are not employed are eligible to nominate as parents for the school council at that school. Once the nomination form is completed, return it to the principal within the time stated on the notice of election. You will receive a Nomination Form Receipt in the mail following the receipt of your completed nomination. Generally, if there are more nominations received than there are vacancies on council, a ballot will be conducted during the two weeks after the call for nominations has closed.

### **Remember**

- Ask at the school for help if you would like to stand for election and are not sure what to do
- Consider standing for election to council this year
- Be sure to vote in the elections.
- **Contact the principal for further information.**

## **A FEW REMINDERS**

### **PERSONAL GOODS BROUGHT TO SCHOOL**

Personal property is often brought to school by students and visitors. This can include mobile phones, electronic games, calculators, toys, sporting equipment and cars parked on school premises.

The Department does not hold insurance for personal property brought to school and it has no capacity to pay for any loss or damage to such property. Therefore, parents are reminded to discourage children bringing valuable items to school.

All mobile phones brought to school must be checked in at the office before school begins and signed out at the end of the day. Students are not permitted to have mobile phones in the classrooms or in their bags.

### **STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE ARRANGEMENTS**

Below is an excerpt from a memo from the Department of Education which I draw to the attention of all our families.

"Parents are reminded that the Department does not provide personal accident insurance for students. Parents and Guardians are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including any transport costs, including ambulance.

Student accident insurance policies are available from some commercial insurers. These cover a range of medical expenses not covered by Medicare or private health insurance."

### **STAFF CAR PARK**

**The car park is for Staff and vehicles who have the permission of the school to park. This has to be the case because we cannot accommodate all parents in the car park, even if it is raining. We have had some instances of parents racing into the driveway, ignoring the fact that there may be parents with toddlers in that area. This is a dangerous practice and threatens the safety of our children and families.**

Please communicate this message to all your family members who may be coming up to the school to collect children. The only exceptions to this ruling is people who have contacted the office and explained that they have a disability or picking up sick children. Those who have a heavy delivery for the school are also allowed in the car park. In these instances a permit will be issued to place on the dashboard of the vehicles.

**Please, for the safety of you and your children at drop off and pick up times, use the School Crossing to avoid any unwanted incidents.**

## **HEALTH NEWS**

### **INFECTIOUS DISEASES**

Department of Health has guidelines regarding infectious diseases.

All infectious diseases, eg. Chicken pox, measles, mumps, impetigo (school sores), etc. must be reported to the school and to your doctor. In turn, the school is required to notify the Department of Health immediately. A notice will then be sent home to parents warning of any illnesses within the school.

Before your child returns to school, a **medical clearance must be supplied by your GP.**

For those children who are not immunised, the Department guidelines state that, “during an outbreak of an infectious disease, DHHS directs children not immunised by a vaccine-preventable disease to be excluded until advised by the school that attendance can be resumed.”

### **SEVERE ALLERGIES (ANAPHYLAXIS)**

**We have some students at Kalinda who have a SEVERE allergic reaction (Anaphylactic shock) to the following foods:**

<b>Eggs</b>	<b>Kiwi Fruit</b>
<b>Peanuts</b>	<b>Cashews</b>
<b>Walnuts</b>	<b>Almonds</b>

**All tree nuts – including hazelnuts and by-products, eg. Nutella.**

This is an extremely serious condition and we must treat it with great care and concern.

We do realise that labels on processed products can be very difficult to read and interpret, but we do ask you to be cautious in food preparation as this condition is very serious if children come into contact with these foods in any way.

**Our school canteen will not be selling products containing these allergens EXCEPT cooked egg in baked products, and mayonnaise. These items are always identified on the canteen menu and prepared separately. Families with allergies should make sure that any canteen order is clearly marked as a child with an allergy.** All children at Kalinda must be safe at school and it is the responsibility of the school and its community to make sure that happens. Even though these children may not be in your child’s grade it is still possible for playground equipment to be contaminated by residue on fingers, etc.

Please communicate this message to the rest of your family if they are making lunches for your children.

### **ASTHMA**

Please ensure any children who have asthma (even if just occasional) have up to date asthma plans and up to date medication at the school.

## **WORKING BEE**

Kalinda PS relies on Working Bees to maintain the extensive grounds that we're very fortunate to have. We are asking that each family attend at least one Working Bee during the year to help keep the playgrounds and surrounding areas safe and well maintained for our children.

Not only are Working Bees an opportunity to contribute to your children's school, but they are also a great opportunity to meet other parents at the post-Working Bee BBQ.

We have scheduled 8 Working Bee dates for 2019, including five Sundays to provide flexibility to families who may have Saturday commitments. Working Bees start at 10am and run for approximately 2 hours. Children are very welcome to attend.
