From the Principal.....

BIG DIGGERS AND LOTS OF WORK!

STAFF CAR PARK

One of the works around the school has involved a reconstruction of the overflow car park at the rear of the bitumen car park. This space will formalise the boundaries of the car park, however, the space will not hold any more cars than it does now. The area will be for Kalinda Staff only, unless organised with the office beforehand.

As always, we are very concerned about the safety of our students, therefore, the car park has been altered so it is pushed against the fence as much as possible. This will inhibit traffic through the area and I do ask that parents respect that by not driving into the car park to drop off or pick up your child. Please let your extended family members know of this arrangement.

Over the next few weeks we are planning to plant out the bank leading up to the car park and installing a fence and stairs down to the school building.

If you have visited the school you will notice our dry creek bed near the Foundation playground. The children love exploring this area and it is a very practical area for us as it has become part of our drainage system. Hopefully we will not have a Kalinda "lake" near the Foundation area again!

During this weekend, the roof is going to be restored over the red pergola, so there will be covered seating for parents waiting for their young children. We will still be working on this area at a later date to terrace further the bank leading up to the Foundation playground.

In front of the school we have taken out all the cracked concrete in the area near the Canteen door and improving this area by adding large rocks and seating. This will be a really lovely area for people to sit when they visit the school and for children to spend some quiet time.

The students are finding all this work very exciting, especially when we do have big diggers around the school.

NEW BUILDING!!

Next week we are taking delivery of another new double portable classroom. This has come as a very nice surprise and we will certainly be appreciative of the extra space. The classroom will be delivered in five pieces next Tuesday so there will be very large cranes and trucks in the area. We will be relocating some grades into the main building for the day, if necessary. We are using the same contractors who delivered the new building at the end of last year and we were very pleased with their work. The building will be located along the back path on the lower side. We will be building a ramp from the building leading onto the pathway for access.

I do request that parents deliver their children via other pathways on that day.

5/6JDK Strike Gold

Monday, a day of excitement for pumped students from Grades 5/6K, J and D . 83 students boarded the two buses for our school camp to Log Cabin Camp.

Soon after arrival we split up into four groups. Each group did an activity. The activities were a 16 metre Giant Swing where you could go forwards, backwards or even UPSIDE DOWN! The other activities were archery, frisbee golf and the flying fox. Time flew by and very soon dinner was served. For dinner there was a range of meats such as: chicken, sausages and meat patties. They also had a potato salad and a green salad. After a long day of fun everyone settled into their cabins well.

The next day we travelled to the past. We took a short bus ride to Sovereign Hill. It really was like we travelled back in time. People were walking around the streets all dressed in big, full dresses and formal suits. We wandered around and went to a range of activities. We went into Red Hill Mine and walked through dimly lit underground tunnels. We listened to the story of the Welcome Nugget's discovery. We also learnt about the Chinese who stayed in Ballarat during the gold rush. Olden day bowling and panning for gold was another two of our favourite activities. Many students actually found gold flakes while panning for gold and they put them into a special little bottle that enabled you to see the flakes clearly because one side was black.

At 8:00pm on Tuesday night, we travelled back to Sovereign Hill for 'Blood On The Southern Cross' light and sound show. We were all dazzled by the shining lights, sounds and fog that rose from the scenery. There were no actors in the show, which surprised many of us. They used sound effects and a recorded script to tell the miner's stories. We rode a glowing, long bus to a new destination. We sat in a seemingly normal theatre. We all were amazed when the wall opened up to an outdoor scene filled with tents, buildings and an eerie fog. The loud sounds from the show startled many of us. The story it told was of the lead up to the Eureka Stockade battle. When the show finished we all crashed on the bus. We all dragged our feet into our cabins.

Our last day of camp! Our first activity was hut building. Everyone was challenged by trying to build a hut with whatever was lying around, tin, sticks, tyres and crates. Everyone had a great time building a hut just like the gold miners would. We also made damper and drank billy tea. To make the damper we used plain flour and water and we cooked it on top of an open fire.

Afterwards we went to M.A.D.E. (Museum of Australian Democracy at Eureka). It is an amazing museum, which is situated on the actual site of the Eureka Stockade battle site. We all got to see the Eureka flag itself! It was torn and tattered but it was gigantic! We all saw glittering gold and got to design our own flag.

Unfortunately, we then had to board the bus to go home after lunch. Sadly our trip has ended, but we can bring home great memories to share.

Skoolbo – Go! Aussie Kids Go!

This is a great new site to help children with Reading and Maths. Children are immersed in an incredible learning world and become highly motivated by the inbuilt rewards mechanisms designed to encourage healthy use and to maximise learning.

Your child has been provided by their teacher with an account that grants full free use of the program both at home and school. As a parent you are able to view your child's results via the Parent Dashboard by visiting <http://dashboard.skoolbo.com.au/>.

There is no advertising on Skoolbo and there are no in-app purchases. Children are not able to communicate on Skoolbo and there is no possibility of unsafe interactions.

How to get going at home:

Option 1 (Download):

Visit www.skoolbo.com.au/downloads and download the software. Skoolbo is available on tablets (iPads and Androids), computers (PCs and Macs) and through the Internet browser.

- Open the software and select Parents.
- Insert your child's username (given to them by their classroom teacher)
- The password (colour BLACK and the animal BEE).

Option 2 (Play on the internet):

- Go straight to the site: <http://dashboard.skoolbo.com.au/> and click on sign in
- Insert your child's username (given to them by their classroom teacher)
- The password (colour BLACK and the animal BEE).
- Our school number for Skoolbo is **28305TY** (you may need this when downloading the site)

Tips for Maximum Benefit:

- Don't let other children (or adults) play on your child's account. Skoolbo uses a smart algorithm that determines the most appropriate learning activities specifically for your child based on his or her recent performance. Other users could affect the level of activity presented to your child.
- Celebrate your child's successes. Examples include 1,000 Correct Answer milestones and other improvement awards.

RECIPE OF THE WEEK!

- ◆ **Makes 12**
- ◆ **Cooking Time: 20 minutes**

Choc Chip Banana Muffins

What you need:

- 60g butter
- ½ cup castor sugar
- 2 cups self-raising flour
- ½ cup milk
- 2 eggs
- 2 ripe bananas
- 1 cup Choc Bits



- Preheat oven to 200°C. Either grease a medium muffin tray (12 sections) or line muffin tray with paper cases.
- Melt butter in a small saucepan or heat-proof bowl in the microwave. Set aside to cool slightly.
- Sift flour into a mixing bowl. Stir in sugar. Make a well in the centre of dry ingredients.
- Using a whisk lightly beat milk, eggs and butter in a jug. Add to dry ingredients, along with mashed banana. Using a wooden spoon, gently mix ingredients until just combined. Stir in choc bits.
- Don't beat the mixture or the muffins will be tough.
- Spoon the mixture evenly into the muffin cases. Bake for 20 minutes or until firm on top when lightly touched. Leave in the tray for 3 minutes. Transfer the muffins to a rack to cool.
